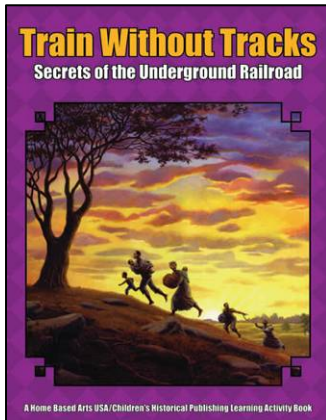




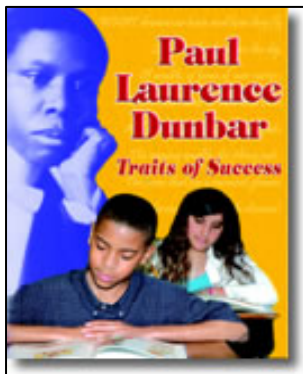
UNDERGROUND RAILROAD LEARNING ACTIVITY BOOK (\$4.99)

perseverance along with the right support can change the lives of people and the world in which they live.

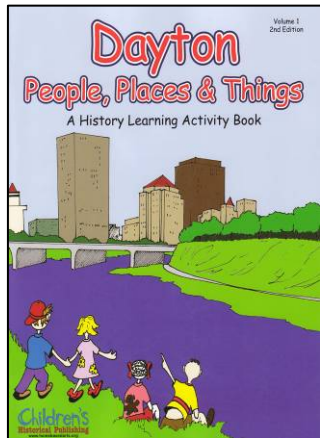
PAUL LAURENCE DUNBAR LEARNING ACTIVITY BOOK (\$4.99)

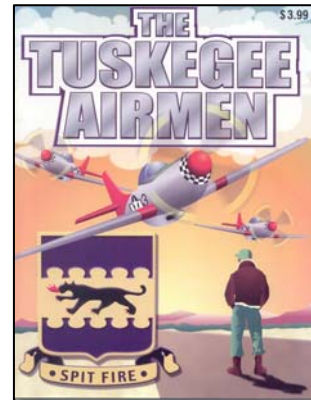


Never underestimate the importance local history.

THE TUSKEGEE AIRMEN LEARNING ACTIVITY BOOK (\$3.99 each)

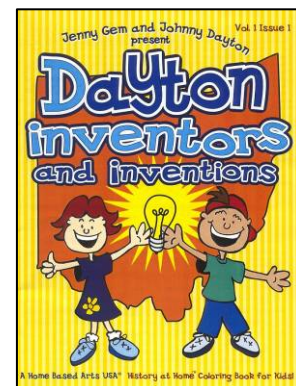

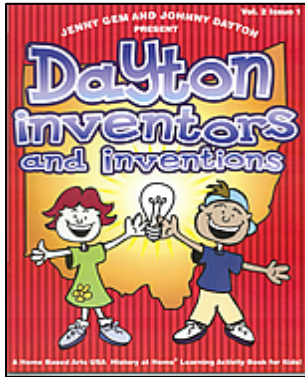
DAYTON INVENTORS AND INVENTIONS VOL. 1 (\$3.99 each)

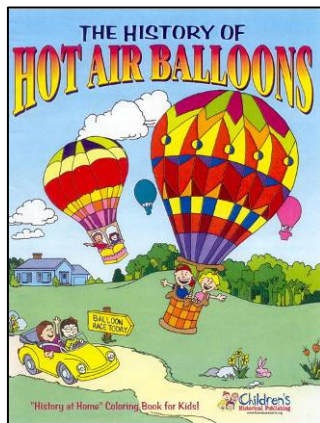


DAYTON INVENTORS AND INVENTIONS VOL. 2 (\$3.99)

Did you know there were more than 1,000 women who flew in defense of our country during WWII?

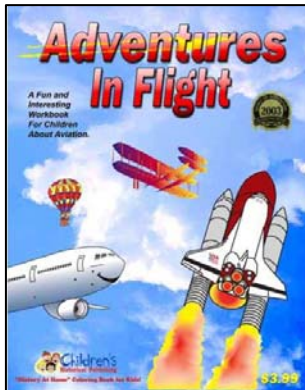
Did you know that in the 1970's when women were first hired as airline pilots, many were asked not to wear makeup and to keep their hair cut short?"

women who have played a part throughout aviation history.

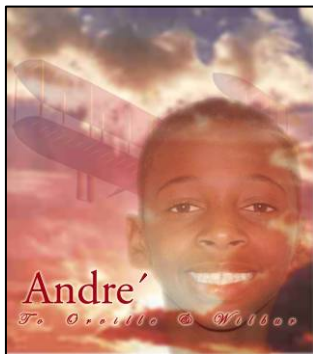
ADVENTURES IN FLIGHT (\$3.99 each)

Have you ever wanted to fly? Children also dream of soaring through the skies. **Adventures In Flight** will draw them into a world of aviation, and introduce them to the



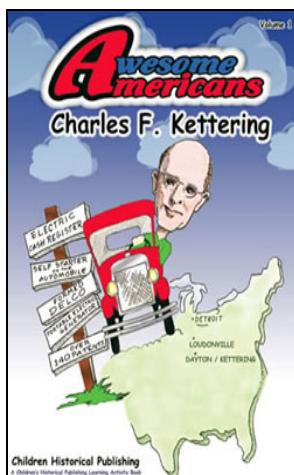

TO ORVILLE AND WILBUR CD - \$9.99 each



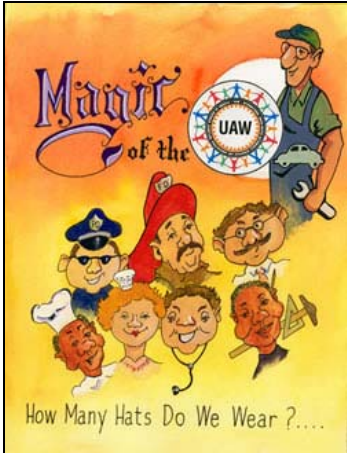

Charles F. Kettering held over 140 invention patents and now he is the subject of the Awesome Americans series by Children's Historical Publishing (CHP). "Boss Kett," as he was known in his day, helped found Sloan-Kettering Cancer Institute and the DELCO division of GM. He also made some of the most significant advancements to the automobile, from the self-starter and quick drying paint to the automatic transmission. Other inventions include the electric cash register, portable electric generator, and many more featured in this Learning Activity Book. Mr. Kettering left a remarkable footprint. He was one of the greatest inventors in U.S history. With illustrations by artist Leonard Williams and teacher's guide, children will enjoy a rich history of Mr. Kettering with matching games, word searches, fill in the blanks and an essay prize contest. NEW! MAGIC OF THE UAW (\$4.99)



How well do you know the history of the UAW? Did you know:

- From 1937-1941 the UAW worked to bring the union into Ford, accepting the help of one creative Ford worker who installed an extra radio button in all new cars tuned to the Union's station.
- UAW President Walter Reuther was good friends with Martin Luther King Jr. The UAW and Mr. Reuther contributed greatly to the civil rights movement and participated in marches with Dr. King.
- The longest UAW strike of nine years took place at the Ohio Crankshaft factory in Cuyahoga Heights. The workers stood united and earned fully paid health insurance, wage increases and pension credit, plus all strikers got their jobs back.
- Ivy League universities including Cornell and Columbia, plus fine schools such as New York University and Boston University, have employees that belong to the UAW.

The first learning-activity book about the UAW has just been released by Children's Historical Publishing (CHP), a division of Home Based Arts USA. "Magic of the UAW" illustrates the historical people, places and events of the UAW. From the union's early days working with President Roosevelt in the 1930s to the major accomplishments of today, this fun and educational book shows how the UAW has been a pioneer for the rights of American workers.
